almost a city unto itself, Harlem is one of the most famous neighborhoods in the world. Founded by the Dutch in 1658, Harlem was once farmland and the first US home of hundreds of thousands of European immigrants. The center of New York City's African American culture, Harlem is a diverse neighborhood with a vibrant and influential history. Your **fully guided tour** explores the changing face of Harlem, with special focus on the Harlem Renaissance of the

1920s and 1930s. A literary, music, drama, and art revival in Harlem, the Renaissance period cultivated and nurtured the talents of great jazz musicians like Duke Ellington and Cab Calloway, and authors such as Zora Neale Hurston and W.E.B. Du Bois. Home to the famed Apollo Theater and Cotton Club, the effect of the Harlem Renaissance can still be felt in America's artistic and cultural life today.

#### Day 3 - Friday, March 16 - NEW YORK CITY

- make your way to the **Fashion Museum at F.I.T**. (address: Seventh Avenue at 27th Street, NY 10001)
- arrive and check in for your tour
- tour begins
- tour ends; time to explore the other exhibitions in chaperoned groups
- time to purchase lunch perhaps at the Chelsea Market
- enjoy a stroll along The High Line which runs through three of Manhattan's most dynamic neighborhoods: the Meatpacking District, West Chelsea, and Hell's Kitchen/Clinton. When the High Line was built in the 1930s, these neighbourhoods were dominated by industrial and transportation uses. Now many of the warehouses and factories have been converted to art galleries, design studios, retailers, restaurants, museums, and residences.
- make your way to the <u>Museum of Modern Art (MOMA)</u> (address: 11 W 53rd St, New York, NY 10019; nearest subway: 5th Ave @ 53 St or Rockefeller Center)
- admission is free for all visitors during UNIQLO Free Friday Nights, every Friday evening from **4:00 to 8:00 p.m**. To avoid long lines, visitors are strongly encouraged to arrive after 6:00 p.m. Please refrain from bringing large bags, as all items larger than 11 x 15 x 5" must be checked. The line for UNIQLO Free Friday tickets begins at the Museum's 54 Street entrance. Your UNIQLO Free Friday Night ticket permits entry to all Museum galleries and exhibitions. Film admission is free, but a separate ticket is required.
- make your way to Times Square area
- time to purchase dinner in chaperoned groups
- make your way to **Discovery Times Square** (address: 226 West 44th Street, NY 10036; nearest subway: Times Square-42 St)
- arrival at Discovery Times Square; group leader is required to check in with DTS Management before bringing students into the building
- entry to **Current Exhibition (if Fashion related TBA)** (please allow 1 to 1 ½ hours for the duration of your visit chaperones must accompany student groups throughout the exhibit)
- after your visit return by subway or on foot to your hotel

- walk as a group to the restaurant
- group dinner
- dinner ends; walk to the Theatre
- arrive in time to pick up your tickets and find your seats

- show ends; return to your hotel by foot or by subway

  - on arrival please enter through the Museums entrance at 81st Street; group leader to check in at the Group Registration Desk located in the Carson Family Hall Uris Center for Education

- enjoy a self-guided visit of one of the world's great art museums works date from prehistoric times to the present it houses collections from all continents, including ancient Egyptian art and American sculpture and decorative art since colonial times those interested can join a free guided tour Fashion in Art which offers insights into the landmarks of costume history and examines the different materials used from the sixth century B.C. through modern times (tour times TBA)
- exit the museum and enjoy a walk through Central Park

- on your way to the observatories you will explore the Sustainability Exhibit this thought-provoking installation translates the technical retrofit story into an easy-to-understand experience that introduces the top of energy efficiency in the context of the Empire State Building, New York City, and the planet; the vibrant exhibit combines physical artifacts with technology and seamlessly integrates digital and sculptural elements to create interactive museum that educates and entertains visitors
